

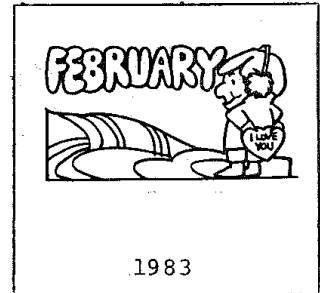

April 3 (Easter)	When He Rose From the Grave?

BUILDING FUND...

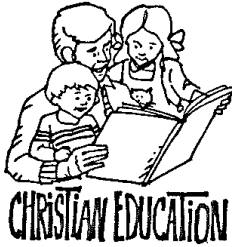

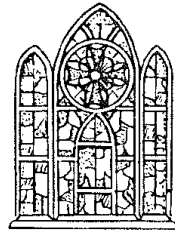
BITS and PIECES...
