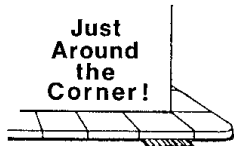

We thank God that He has blessed us and has enabled the following things to happen: our LCEF loan has been approved by the congregation and also the Rocky Mountain District; the building plans have been okayed by the City Planning Commission and the City Council; bids on the site work are being reviewed; and the architect's final plans are being completed.

Actual church construction should begin sometime in July and plans are being made to house and welcome the Laborers for Christ team, due to arrive then.

Still up for sale are the present church building and the three duplex lots on our property. Please pray that the Lord will help us to find buyers for these in the near future.

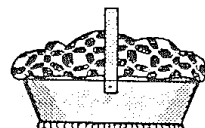

OUR FIRST PRIORITY...

The summer of 1985 is going to be a busy one for the Concordia family. In just a few weeks we will begin construction of our new church building. We are making plans for Vacation Bible School during the first week of August. Sunday School will continue during the summer Sundays. Some within the congregation have also committed themselves to a church softball team. Along with family vacations, work responsibilities, and personal recreational pursuits, the theme of this short summer will be "Busy, Busy, Busy."

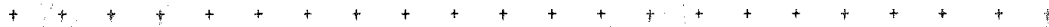
Lest we get our priorities out of order, let us be reminded that the Christians after the first Pentecost "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers" (Acts 2:42). Doubtless, their lives were busy, too! But of first importance for them was worship, study, fellowship and prayer. The word "devoted" in the Greek has the sense "to continually be in," "to persist at," "to remain with."

The first priority for us this summer is our regular worship at 8 or 10:30 a.m. on Sundays, and our study of God's Word at 9:15 a.m. Only as we are nourished and strengthened through God's Word and Sacraments can we get on with the Christian life. Only as we are persistent in our private and corporate prayers will our plans be accomplished to God's glory. It is noted that every great decision in the apostolic period, and in the whole life of early Christianity, was sustained by persistent prayer. And only as we remain strong in the fellowship of Christian friends can we be supported and encouraged in our individual lives.

If we have our priorities straight, this summer will be one of God-blessed "business" (Kingdom business) rather than one of empty and exhausting "busy-ness." But we must keep first things first!

The Rocky Mountain District, of which Concordia is a member congregation, has asked its members for some help. The District ended the 1984 fiscal year with a \$44,000 deficit. Since there are about 44,000 confirmed members in the District, a letter was sent to each congregation asking for a special gift (over our regular mission giving) of one dollar per confirmed member. This would be \$178 for Concordia.

The Voter's Assembly of Concordia decided to take a special door offering and to send the money received as Concordia's response. This special offering will be received on Sunday, June 16, after each service. All our members are asked to respond as they can to help the District, which has helped us so much in our building program.

Charlotte Riggi is recuperating at home in Yampa after undergoing surgery in Denver.....Lou and Florence

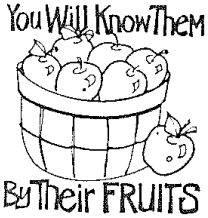
Volberding have been staying with Lou's brother in Akron, CO for a month-and-a-half while Lou built a new kitchen for his brother.....
