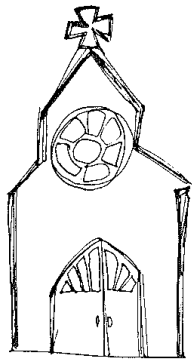

Earl Maze will need help completing the plumbing and heating. Ed Warner and Larry Worrell may need help finishing the wiring and installing light fixtures.

To stay in the budget, some areas in the church will not be complete when we move in. The basement fellowship area and rest rooms will remain unfinished. The Building Committee anticipated that this would be the situation. From the beginning, we advised the members that building for our total building size needs should take priority over a smaller finished church.

Our work has just begun if we are to accomplish the goal we set for ourselves in building a new church. Our individual gifts of time, talent, and treasure will be extremely important in the months and years to come. The gifts of time and talent have saved thousands of dollars in construction costs so far. Gifts of treasure are greatly magnified by those who give time and talent. When everyone does all he or she can, we are truly doing the Lord's work.

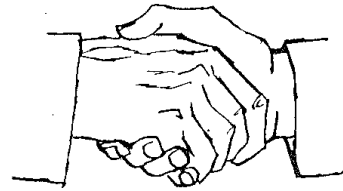

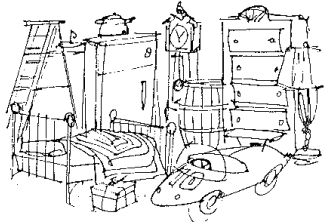

8 ATTENDED...

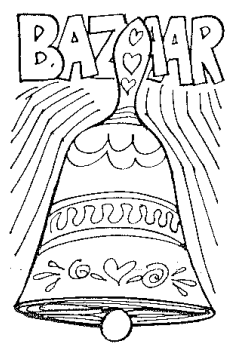

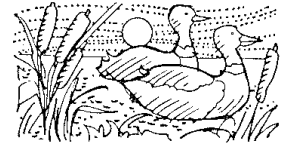

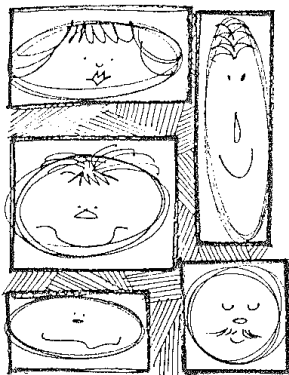
BITS & PIECES...

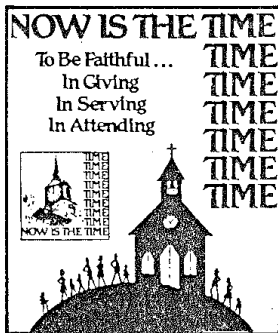
We dare to trust God because He is trustworthy. He proved His love at the cross.
