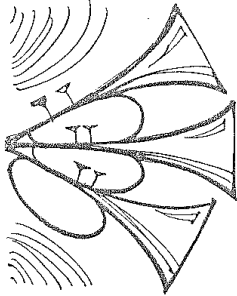

Synod Program



What is it? A combined effort of nearly 6,000 congregations in the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod to help our more than 2.9 million members catch a vision for Mission and Ministry.

What is the goal? Through Alive in Christ we hope to raise between \$60 and \$100 million dollars for special ministry through the end of this century.

How will the funds be used? The breakdown of the offerings will be as follows: 46% to prepare professional church workers for the years ahead 21% to establish new mission congregations in North America; 7.5% to be used for World Missions 7.3% to assist those retired church workers who were not covered by a proper retirement program; 3.5% to be used for new communication technology so that we can be better prepared to spread the Gospel; 14.7% to be used to eliminate the Synod's operating deficit which occurred during the inflationary 1970s.

How can we be involved? During the next two months each family in our congregation will have the opportunity to prayerfully commit a gift for Alive in Christ. This gift is one which will be collected over a 3 year period.

Who is directing the appeal at Concordia? Dennis Scheiwe and Pastor Norm will make the materials available to the members of our congregation.

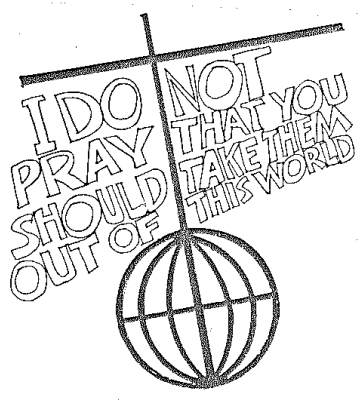

gathering of believers might be ONE. . .

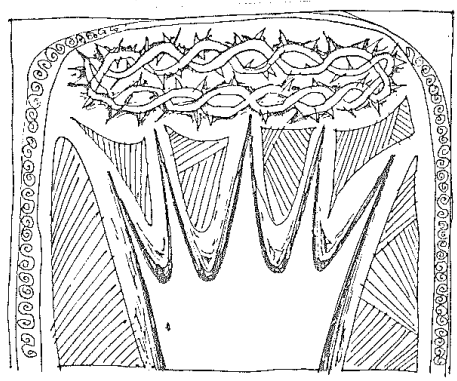
- ONE in faith and trust in Jesus Christ;

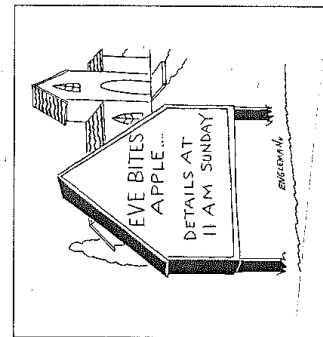


- March 12 - Midweek Lenten Service 7:00 p.m.

- Sunday School Movie 10:30 a.m.

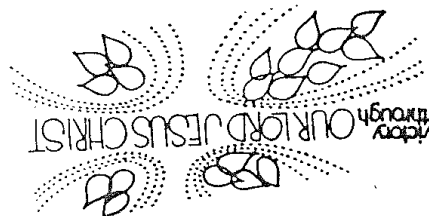
(The noonday devotional services continue during the Wednesdays of Lent at 12:15 p.m. Check the calendar for locations.)
