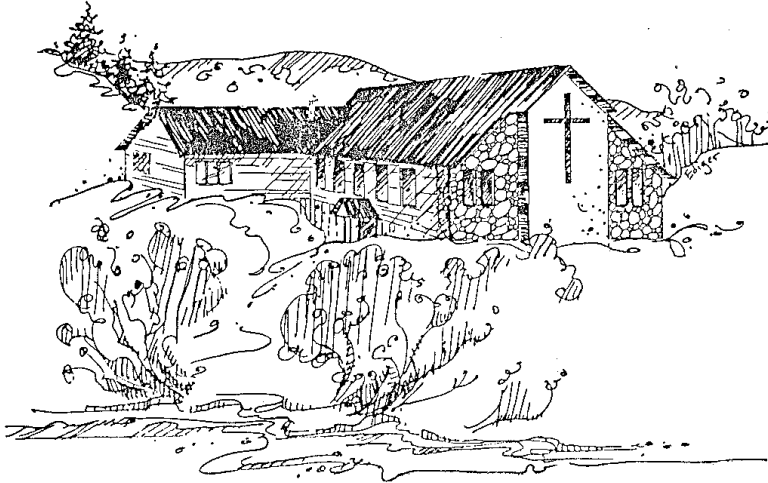

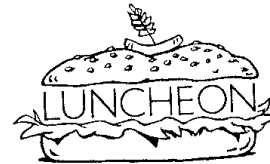

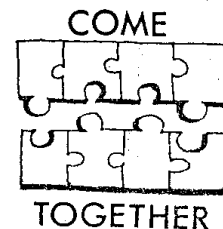

DANCE PLANNED...

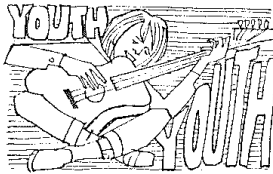
Concordia Youth Group is hosting an adult dance, Saturday, June 7, from 8:00-11:00 p.m. in the basement of our new church.

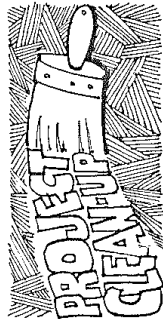
BITS AND PIECES...
