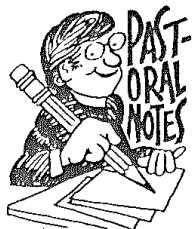

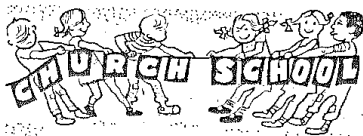
+++ Don't forget the Voters Meeting on July 14th!!!

District Sunday School Convention --- Plan ahead! Put "Bound to Grow" on your calendar! The date is August 29th at St. John's Lutheran Church in Denver.

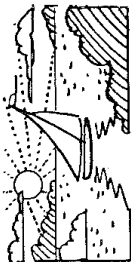
This convention is for everyone involved in parish education, Sunday School teachers, aides, Superintendents, Pastors, VBS staff, and Youth workers.
