

We should start to see some of our friends from SUN CITY and other warm areas this month. We look forward to having them with us for worship and other events, and to share the joy of our life together in Christ.


JESUS IS LORD during the summertime, too!

#### LIFE TOGETHER IN THE SPIRIT...



In the Pentecost season we celebrate the Spirit-given Life we have together as God's people in Christ. What follows are excerpts from an article by Dr. Jay Rochelle of the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago.

C.S. Lewis was once talking with a fellow member of his church. That man complained to him about yet another member who was always rude and nasty and difficult to be around. Lewis said to him, "Yes, but think what an aw-

ful person X would be were he not a Christian."

Rochelle continues, "Think what awful persons we could be...I used to think this was a silly thing for Lewis to say. But as years go by, when I find myself frustrated or angry, when I am vexed at other Christians who can't see the world aright (that is, my way) or when I want to be left alone and turn surly when I have to talk with yet one more person, I remember Lewis' words.

"Let's face it, people get on your nerves in church. There is that one nervous man who insists on questioning everything at church council meetings. There is the woman with the excess lipstick who asks off-the-wall questions at the annual meeting. There is the thin man who wears thin ties whose view of the Bible is quirkier than anything you've ever heard... The church is full of people who get on your nerves. Probably you get on someone else's nerves.

"But the Holy Spirit has called us through the Gospel, enlightened us with spiritual gifts, and sanctified and preserved us in truefaith." So writes Luther in his explanation to the third article of the Creed, the one about the Spirit in whose season we now worship and work.

"Awful people are lurking in your parish, too, but at the same time they are <u>called</u> people, they are <u>enlightened</u> people, and they are <u>sanctified</u> and <u>preserved</u> people. Before their personalities took form they were called into Christ through the Spirit at their baptisms. Before their minds filled up with funny ideas and pigheaded perceptions they were given the mind of

"There are days on which God loses the place of honor in my mind, in fact, any place at all. In this Pentecost season, however, I am reminded that I am kept safe in the mind of God through the Spirit...

"I need to be called back to the heart of the faith: that God acts before I do, that Christ died and rose in order that I might die and rise daily to the many little and great ways in which I shut out others to sink into my own ego, and that even if I am an awful person, nevertheless I have been baptized and I belong. It is my church, too, and tomorrow--I promise!--

I'll try to act like <u>you</u> matter."

There is food for thought here for our life together with sisters and brothers in Christ at Concordia!


