

## BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

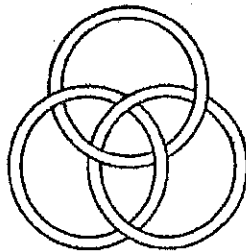

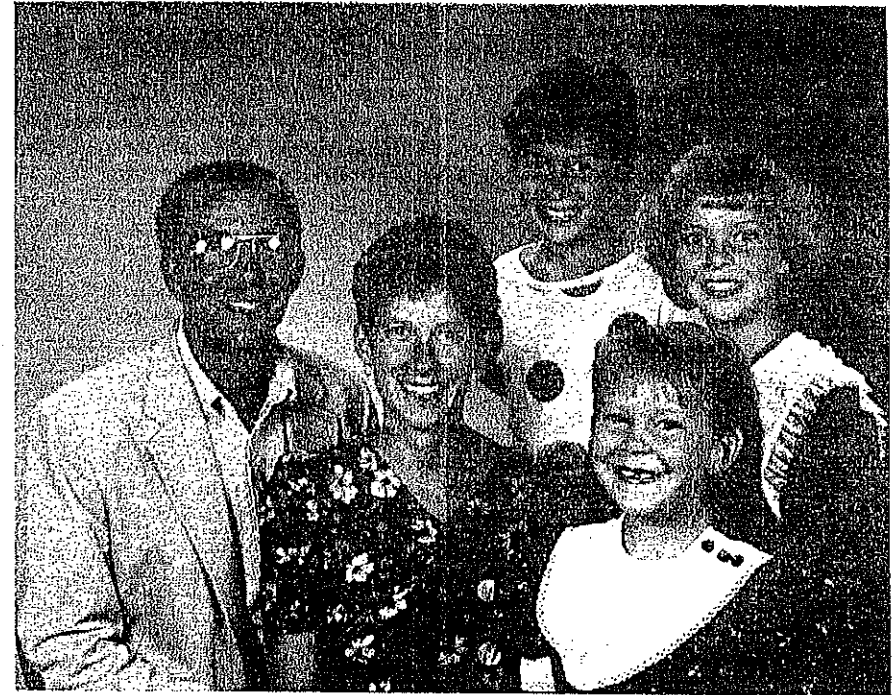

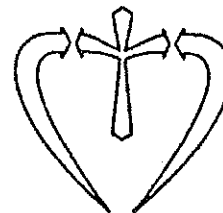

Pastor: Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Reverend Tim Cartwright has  
been called to be a pastor of Concordia Lutheran congregation. Near  
now what Holy Scripture says concerning the office of the public  
ministry.

Reading from Scripture

Pastor: Dear brother in Christ, the Lord grant that you receive and keep these  
words in your heart that you may be strengthened and encouraged in  
your labors.

God gathers His Church by and around His holy Word and also  
grants it growth and increase. That this may be done, he has estab-  
lished the office of the public ministry into which you were ordained.  
It is fitting that you would again acknowledge the responsibilities of  
this holy office in which you are to serve this congregation.

In the presence of God and this congregation, I now ask you:

Do you believe the canonical books of the Old and New Testaments  
to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith  
and practice?

Cartwright: I do.

Pastor: Do you accept the three Ecumenical Creeds, namely, the Apostles',  
the Nicene, and the Athanasian Creeds as faithful testimonies to the  
truth of the Holy Scriptures, and do you reject all the errors which  
they condemn?

Pastor: Do you believe that the Unaltered Augsburg Confession is a true  
exposition of the Word of God and a correct exhibition of the doc-  
trine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church; that the Apology of the  
Augsburg Confession, the Small and Large Catechisms of Martin  
Luther, the Smalcald Articles, the Treatise on the Authority and  
Primacy of the Pope, and the Formula of Concord - as these are con-  
tained in the Book of Concord - are also in agreement with this one  
scriptural faith?

Pastor: Do you solemnly promise that you will perform the duties of your  
office in accordance with these Confessions, or Symbols, and that all  
your teaching and your administration of the sacraments will be in  
conformity with the Holy Scriptures and with the aforementioned  
Symbols?

Pastor: Will you faithfully instruct both young and old in the chief articles of  
Christian doctrine; will you forgive the sins of those who repent, and  
will you promise never to divulge the sins confessed to you; will you  
minister faithfully to the sick and dying; will you demonstrate to the  
Church a constant and ready ministry, admonishing the people to a  
lively confidence in Christ and holy living?

life?

receive him, show him that love, honor and obedience in the Lord

pray for him always that in his labors he may retain a cheerful spirit
