

Greetings in the name of our risen Lord!


Recently two news stories caught my attention. The first story was related to teenage alcohol/drug use. Levels of abuse/use are now paralleling the crisis of the late 60's and early 70's. The second story related the need to pass laws identifying tobacco as an addictive substance. Legislation will be aimed at curtailing teen access to tobacco products.

I know the reality of addiction to both of the above mentioned areas. They are real and they are life-robbing. We have a good area of ministry here at Concordia...it is our Thursday Evening Recovery Group.

I was having dinner with one of the girls recently at a local eating establishment...a bar adjoined the dining area. My daughter asked why the noise level was so high. The voices were almost "shouting" loud. The non-smoking eating area was filled with second hand fog. I looked at my watch...it was 6:45 pm. I told my daughter that "Happy Hour" (an oxymoron) was drawing to a close. The noise and smoke were directly related to the "adults" and old people legally drinking and smoking. We did not see one teenager in that crowded bar as we left.

It seems to me that if we are going to curb "teenage" use, we must curb the appetite of adults. A scripture passage comes to mind:

"Everything is permissible...but not everything is beneficial." (I Cor. 6:12)

Budget

As of the beginning of September (1996) our congregation is right on target in meeting our 1996 monthly budget. We did <u>not</u> end the summer month "in the red". We thank God for this financial reality.

In order to continue to progress and develop our shared ministry here at Concordia we must be aware of our financial obligations. 1997 will require some new budget challenges. It is an exciting time here in Steamboat Springs.

20% of congregational members take care of 80% of congregational needs.

On average 37% of congregational members worship on any given Sunday.

President or Vice-President Comment

The president of our congregation is Clair Erickson. Our vice-president is Brian Thornton. These officers are elected for <u>one-year</u> terms. We are presently preparing for new elections here at Concordia. These two people have served our congregation well this past year.

The president, vice-president, as well as all our council positions, are <u>not</u> positions of power and glamour. These positions are <u>servant</u> roles here in our congregation. Day-to-day, nuts and bolts concerns accompany their particular areas of service. Our congregation needs people to care for these offices.

A congregation must have a way to govern itself and make collective, corporate, shared decisions. Our church council meets 8 times a year. Anybody is welcome at these meetings. The Church Council and our boards bring reports and decision needs to a "Voters Meeting" 4 times a year. Anybody is welcome at these meetings.

Board of Elders

Outreach and Assimilation

Concordia's Outreach and Assimilation Board is alive and well! Here are just a couple of the projects they are working on...or recently completed.

- 1. Reception for new members (Aug 25 11 new members were received)
- 2. Community Outdoor Worship Service
- 3. Preparing for another New Members Sunday in late September or early October
- 4. This board commits to pray for a specific area of our ministry each month.
- 5. Overseeing a "sponsor" program for the assimilation of new members. Each new household is matched up with an established household to help the "getting acquainted" time period.
- 6. Generally raising our congregation's mission statement that is an extension of Matt.28: 20 "The Great Commission."

Stewardship

The Stewardship Board of Concordia is working on some significant areas of concern here in our congregation. Some are mentioned below:

- 1. How can we identify areas of "volunteer" need?
- 2. How can we identify members to address those areas of need?
- 3. How can we help those volunteers succeed in their volunteer area?
- 4. Do we need a paid volunteer coordinator here at Concordia?
- 5. Do we need a one-day workshop on volunteerism?

A bottom line concern of this board is best stated: "How can we care collectively for our congregation?"

Self-centeredness

The ancient Greeks had a legend that Narcissus, the son of the river god, had fallen in love with himself after seeing his image in a pool of water. A seer had told his mother that her son must never see himself if he was to mature into manhood. For this reason everything that threw off a reflection, such as metal, was removed. But one day he found a spring that formed a pool filled with crystal-clear water. As Narcissus stooped to drink, he saw his reflection in the pool. He fell desperately in love with himself, and seeking to embrace himself, he fell into the water and drowned.

Everyone is moe or less in love with self. The Bible says, "No one ever hated his own body, but he feeds and cares for it" (Eph. 5:29). And Jesus tells us that if we want to love someone very much, we must love him as much as we love ourselves. "Love your neighbor as yourself." But many people fall in love with themselves to such an abnormal extent that they become extremely selfish and self-centered, that they lose all interest in others or use them only as tools to obtain greater aevantages for themselves. *References*: Prov. 12:15; 20:6; 26:12; Luke 18:10-12; 2 Cor. 10:12; Phil. 2:3.



Caring for the Communion Table:

Scripture teaches us that God has placed into the life of His Church the ongoing gift of Holy Communion. This is a "Thanksgiving Meal" which gives to the believing heart the wonderful gift of forgiveness and the assurance of salvation. In, with, and under the bread and wine of the Lord's Table are the very body and blood of Jesus Christ.

Concordia has established the following guidelines to encourage you to come to the Lord's Table.


- 1. Young people who have been instructed in God's good and guiding Word regarding the truths of the Communion Table are invited to come and receive this real gift of God's grace. Our congregation offers instruction and preparation for the Lord's Table during 7th and 8th grade Confirmation instruction.
- 2. Some young people have prepared for the Lord's Table at an earlier age due to guidance received in another congregation. Those young people are welcome at the Lord's Table here at Concordia.
- 3. Because of the truths present in God's word, Concordia believes that Jesus' body and blood are miraculously present in the bread and wine. Jesus himself said, "This is my body...This is my blood."
- 4. We are guided by God's Word when it states that a person needs to examine themselves prior to coming to the Lord's Table. This "self examination" should result in one being able to recognize the Biblical

truth of "real presence" (#3 above) as well as

the truth that the sinner needs the Savior.

5. When a person comes to the Communion feast, that individual is making a profession of faith. You profess your trust in God's gracious gift of forgiveness. You profess that you hold much in common with those you are communing with.

Please fill out the Communion registration cards on Communion Sundays and give it to an usher as you come to the table. When you come to the Table, come knowing God's grace is for you. If you are yet to be instructed feel free to come and receive a Pastoral blessing.



Heart Listening

What marriages need, especially in this busy and bothered world, is not active listening but heart listening. That phrase may seem trite, but for the Christian and for the person in a relationship of committed love with another, it means something quite profound. The person practicing heart listening -

- hears the "heart plea" that lies behind a loved one's words. The wife who complains about being ignored is sending out a heart plea. She seeks to be reassured, supported, valued, attended to. She is not making a demand. The plea, however, can be heard and accepted only in the heart of the person who is committed to loving her.
- hears with acceptance the same acceptance that God has for us. Heart listeners avoid defensiveness. Heart pleas often have an accusation in them: "You are not doing or being what I'd hoped. You are failing to be what I need you to be. You are less than I'd hoped you would be." Hear the accusation in a husband's question: "Does your family always come first?" Only a committed, loving heart can hear the plea behind those words and respond helpfully.
- keeps forgiveness ready. Hidden heart pleas often arise from less than perfect self understanding. In fact, many heart pleas have a lot of self pity in them. But they also may be speaking a real need or an important message of confession. Heart listeners know that forgiveness is a treasure that must be shared. They know that God's forgiveness has the power to renew. Because heart listeners are forgiven, they can also forgive. This also applies to forgiving themselves. (Ted Schroeder "The Good Shepherd Magazine")

HOW DO YOU DEFINE RECOVERY?

"The process of becoming a whole person by getting rid of old stuff that doesn't work and learning new stuff that does. Becoming your real, true self without using drugs."

"Identifying harmful patterns. Learning new patterns of behavior, and finding resources to support putting them in action."

"Having the courage and patience to learn who you are and what you want and need."

"Having choices."

"Coming to know the self who's been hidden under all the masks and cover-ups.

Realizing that I can live life on its terms and that I am lovable."

Trustees


- Thank God for the fence constructed on our northern boundary.
