There is nothing inherently wrong with strength, unless strength is only used for self and it has not humility as its <u>buffer</u>.


There is nothing inherently wrong with beauty, unless beauty is only used for self and it has not humility as its <u>instructor</u>.

Quiet Times for Parents by H. Norman Wright...A Daily Devotional

After the Feast was over, while his parents were returning home, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but they were unaware of it (Luke 2:43).

Have you ever left your child somewhere, thinking all the time that he or she was with your spouse? It happened to Jesus' parents.

Imagine not being able to find your child for three or four days. What would go through your mind? Would you feel panic, anxiety, worry, blame, or guilt? You wouldn't be able to sleep and eventually soon you would imagine the worst.

Jesus' parents were just like you. You see, Jesus was a child like other children. And the scene described above is a common one for parents.

Then they found Him. He was sitting in the temple teaching the teachers. When Jesus was confronted by His parents, He simply said, "Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?" (verse 49).

Jesus our Savior started out as a baby much

like all other babies. But He was different as a boy. When He sat and talked with some of the brightest minds of the day in the temple, they were amazed. And His parents were astonished. It seems as if a new side of their son was revealed that day.

That's the way it is when you're a parent. Your baby becomes a child, then a teenager, and finally an adult. Each stage brings you the opportunity to be astonished.

How have your children astonished you? Have you written that down? Have you shared that with anyone? Be sure you save your memories because someday they will be very important to you.

There's a beautiful response from Mary about what she learned that day when she found Jesus: "His mother treasured all these things in her heart" (verse 51). Children provide us with experiences to treasure. What do you treasure right now? If you've noticed something to be treasured, why not let your child know?

SUNDAY SCHOOL


















STEWARDSHIP "Complaining About Giving"



Thursday Recovery:

Concordia Lutheran congregation has made a commitment to open its doors to the special needs surrounding those individuals, couples, and families who are dealing with the reality of addiction and recovery. Each Thursday night at 7:00pm a group of people meet in the basement of the church for devotions and support. This meeting is designed to aid the recovering person in the quest for a stronger spiritual life.

Sunday Extended Care Center Worship (ECC)

On the fourth Sunday of each month our congregation is responsible for the care of the worship service at the ECC. The Pastor leads this service with congregational volunteers. There is a need to visit with the residents at the ECC. It is a great way to learn compassion and service. The residents always appreciate a kind contact from visitors.

FAMILY ISSUES

Can you outline a step-by-step set of instructions that will help me discipline my kids correctly?

- 1. Define the boundaries before they are enforced. The most important step in any disciplinary procedure is to establish reasonable expectations and boundaries in advance. The child should know what is and what is not acceptable behavior before he is held responsible for those rules. This precondition will eliminate the overwhelming sense of injustice that a youngster feels when punished. If you haven't defined it don't enforce it!
- 2. When defiantly challenged, respond with confident decisiveness. Once a child understands what is expected, he should then be held accountable for behaving accordingly. When that nose-to-nose confrontation occurs between generations, it is extremely important for the adult to win decisively and confidently. The child has made it clear that he's looking for a fight, and his parents would be wise not to disappoint him!
- 3. Distinguish between willful defiance and childish irresponsibility. Childish irresponsibility is very different from willful defiance and it should be handled more patiently. Be gentle as you teach him to do better. If he fails to respond to your patient instruction, it then becomes appropriate to

administer some well defined consequences (he may have to pay for the item he abused or be deprived of its use, etc.)

4. Reassure and teach after the confrontation is over. After a time of conflict during which the parent has demonstrated his right to lead (particularly if it resulted in tears for the child), the youngster between 2 and 7 (or older) may want to be loved and reassured. By all means, open your arms and let him come! Hold him close and tell him of your love. Rock him gently and let him know, again, why he was punished and how he can avoid the trouble next time.

It is also extremely important to pray with the child at that time, admitting to God that we have all sinned and no one is perfect. Divine forgiveness is a marvelous experience, even for a very young child.

- 5. Avoid impossible demands. Be absolutely sure that your child is capable of delivering what you require. Never punish him for wetting the bed involuntarily or for not becoming potty trained by 1 year of age or for doing poorly in school when he is incapable of academic success. These impossible demands put the child in an unresolvable conflict; there is no way out.
- 6. Let love be your guide! A relationship that is characterized by genuine love and affection is likely to be a healthy one, even though some parental mistakes and errors are inevitable.

"Sir," they said, "from now on give us this bread."




