



Reverend Wayne Koenig

Wayne Koenig was born to Rev. Walter and Alma Koenig in Ogalalla, Nebraska and grew up in Lincoln, NE. He attended Lutheran schools, including St. John's College in Winfield, Kansas, where he met Ruth Hoffmann of St. Louis, Missouri. Wayne and Ruth were married in 1959. Upon graduation from Concordia Seminary in 1961, Pastor Koenig was called to develop a new

Mission Church in Livonia, near Detroit, Michigan. Five other congregations have been served by Pastor Koenig since then, four of which were mission congregations, five of which involved the construction of new facilities. From the East Coast, the Koenigs moved west in 1983 to serve a developing congregation of the Pacific Southwest District in Santa Ynez, CA - Shepherd of the Valley. He then went to Las Vegas and served at Lamb of God Lutheran Church. After retiring from the ministry in the year 2000, he has now graciously served us as our pastor during an interim period.

Ruth has been an active partner in serving these congregations. She has training and skills in Education and Music, and is an accredited Family counselor. There are two Koenig children, Rev. Jeffrey Koenig who is serving a church in Canada. Daughter Kristen is currently teaching Sociology at Concordia University in Bronxville, NY.

We are so blessed to have Pastor Wayne and Ruth serving at Concordia Lutheran Church. It is with much joy that we remember his ordination vows to the ministry 40 years ago.

NEW TESTAMENT LESSON: Ephesians 2:13-22

But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ.

For he himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in his flesh the law with its commandments and regulations. 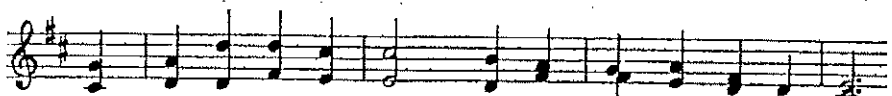

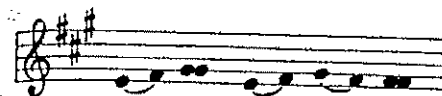

CARING FOR THE COMMUNION TABLE

Scripture teaches us that God has placed into the life of His Church the ongoing gift of Holy Communion. This is a "Thanksgiving Meal" which gives to the believing heart the wonderful gift of forgiveness and the assurance of salvation. In, with, and under the bread and wine of the Lord's Table are the very body and blood of Jesus Christ.

Concordia has established the following guidelines to encourage you to come to the Lord's Table.

1. Young people who have been instructed in God's good and guiding Word regarding the truths of the Communion Table are invited to come and receive this real gift of God's grace. Our congregation offers instruction and preparation for the Lord's Table during 7th and 8th grade Confirmation Instruction.
2. Some young people have prepared for the Lord's Table at an earlier age due to guidance received in another congregation. Those young people are welcome at the Lord's Table here at Concordia.
3. Because of the truths present in God's Word, Concordia believes that Jesus' body and blood are miraculously present in the bread and wine. Jesus himself said, "This is my body... This is my blood."
4. We are guided by God's Word when it states that a person needs to examine themselves prior to coming to the Lord's Table. This "self examination" should result in one being able to recognize the Biblical truth of "real presence" (#3 above) as well as the truth that the sinner needs the Savior.
5. When a person comes to the Communion feast, that individual is making a profession of faith. You profess your trust in God's gracious gift of forgiveness. You profess that you hold much in common with those at the Lord's table.

Please fill out the Communion registration card in the pew and give it to an usher as you come to the table. When you come to the Table, come knowing God's grace is for you. If you are yet to be instructed feel free to come and receive a Pastoral blessing. Please feel comfortable speaking to the Pastor with any concerns.

STATEMENT OF MINISTRY

Concordia Lutheran Church is established on the sole foundation of Jesus Christ. We believe that God's Word, the Bible, is inspired by God and is His complete revelation for the salvation of all people.

Concordia believes that God created the world and continues to this day to preserve and sustain that creation.

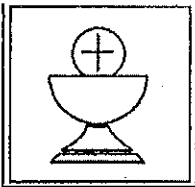
