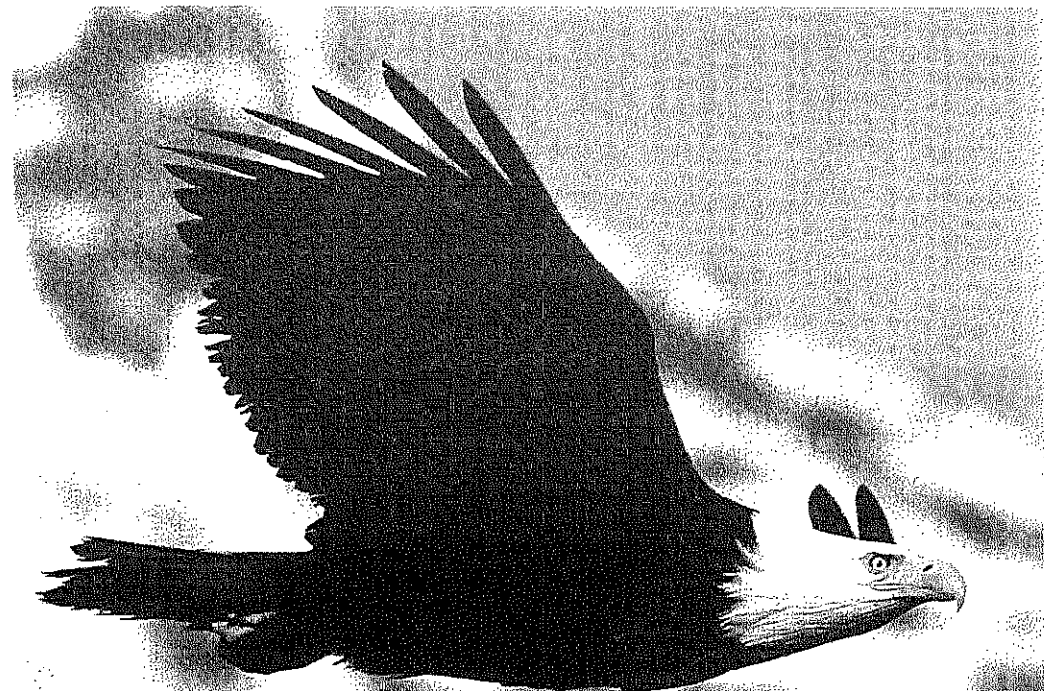


Pastor Scott E. Herbert, son of Wayne E. and Lois J. (nee Scalzo) Herbert, was born on August 3, 1959 in Chicago, Illinois. Three weeks later, he was brought into the family of God through the washing and regeneration of Holy Baptism at Calvary Lutheran Church in Chicago, Illinois. Pastor Scott confessed for himself the faith confessed in his stead at his Baptism as he was confirmed in June, 1973 at Calvary Lutheran Church in Hazel Crest, Illinois. His mother currently lives in Frankfort, Illinois and Pastor Scott's father was taken home to his Lord on December 15, 1999.

Pastor Scott received his elementary education in the public school systems of Chicago, Illinois, Riverside, California, and Markham, Illinois. He graduated from Hillcrest High School in Country Club Hills, Illinois in June, 1977. 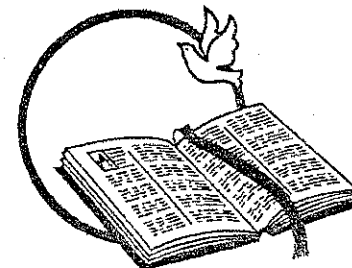

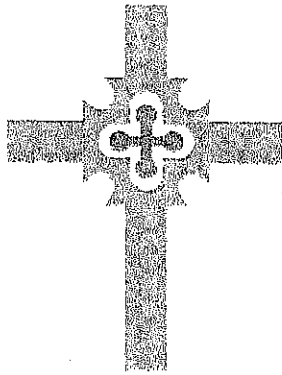

THE RITE OF INSTALLATION

Pastor: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

Pastor: Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Reverend Scott Herbert has been called to be a pastor of Concordia Lutheran Congregation. Hear now what Holy Scripture says concerning the office of public ministry.

READING FROM SCRIPTURE

Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. 
