Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Addiction may be the spiritual disease of our time. It includes chemical dependencies, but it also includes so much more. We buy objects that require us to buy more objects. We make some money and then ratchet up our lifestyle so we need more income just to sustain us. The harder we work, the more work there is to do. The harder we play, the more fun becomes elusive. Yesterday's thrill is today's old news. We always need more.

One of the hallmarks of addiction is building up a "tolerance" – which is the experience of requiring an ever-increasing amount of something in order to be satisfied. That's easily recognizable with drugs and alcohol. But it's harder to spot for those of us who are compulsive about work, food, approval, ministry, possessions, intimacy, security, or any of a number of other socially acceptable addictions.

Addiction is a spiritual issue...and we are all addicted to a variety of substances, behaviors, and thought patterns. Our search for satisfaction and significance cannot be quenched because the things we are addicted to can never stop the longing for more or the search for answers to our struggles.

A section in Haggai seems so current that it is hard to believe it was written over 2,500 years ago. The Israelites had returned from their Babylonian captivity to find the temple in ruins. They intended to rebuild it...but first they had their own places to fix and their own fields to replant. When those things were taken care of...then they would get started on the Temple.

Through the prophet Haggai God asks: *"Is it a time for you yourselves to be living in your paneled houses, while this house remains in a ruin?...Give careful thought to your ways. You have planted much, but have harvested little. You eat, but never have enough. You drink, but never have your fill. You put on clothes, but are not warm. You earn wages, only to put them in a purse with holes in it...Why?...Because of My House which remains a ruin while each of you is busy with his own house."* Haggai 1:4-6, 9 (NIV)

Work that is unproductive, food and drink that don't fill or quench, money that doesn't last, substances that no longer bring the high or mask the pain all indicate– to quote a rock and roll song – that we, like the Israelites, "can't get no satisfaction". God tells them that life is filled with diminishing returns because they have neglected the temple. The only way for them to enjoy the productive, satisfying existence God intends for them is to spend time in that holy place once more. The same thing can be important for us as we look to find satisfaction and significance in our lives to today.

On one level...it is truly a call to make sure that we gather faithfully in worship. In worship we encounter God's Word for instruction and encouragement. In worship we are nourished by the Sacraments. In worship, we gather before the cross of Christ on equal footing. We see God's love and forgiveness demonstrated toward us, and we are empowered to share the love we have first freely received from God.

On another level...in the New Testament Paul writes: *"Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your body."* 1 Corinthians 6:19-20. Satisfaction cannot be found by feeding our addictions. Satisfaction, and a life of significance, can only be found when we each spend intentional time with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ who is "The Bread of Life" and "The Living Water." And we need that time with our Savior every day. Only life with Christ can bring fullness, wellness, wholeness, security, and satisfaction.
